Decedent is actress Natalie Wood who along with her husband a friend, and the skipper of the Wagner boat, were spending the weekend at Catalina Island.

In the early morning hours of Sunday, November 29, 1981, sometime after the group had returned to the boat, which was mored off the Isthmus, became aware that his wife and the boats dinghy were both missing. immediately radioed for help and a search was begun. Mrs. Wagner's body was spotted from the air by a Sheriff's Department helicopter that was enroute to the island to assist in the search. L.A. County Life Guards and two private searchers were the first ones to reach the body of Mrs. Wagner and pulled Her from the water, where upon she was pronounced dead at 0744 hours.

Spoke with Don Whiting, night manager, of Doug's Harbor Reef, Catalina Isthmus, who related the following. Mr. Whiting arrived to work between 1600 and 1700 hours and the Wagner party was already in the bar and had been drinking. The party remained in the bar until approxim tely 1900 to 1930 hours at which time they were seated for dinner at the same location. During the course of the dinner, Mr. Whiting estimates that the group consumed a couple bottles of champagne. Mr. Whiting says the group left the restaurant to return to their boat at approximately 2200 to 2230 hours and that the entire group appeared to him to be intoxicated. Mr. Whiting at this time called Kurt Craig of the Harbor Patrol and asked him to make sure that the group reached their boat safely, which Mr. Craig is reported to have done.

Spoke with who related that the last time he remembers seeing his wife was at 2345 hours. when he realized his wife was missing, placed a radio call for help.

Don Whiting heard Mr. Wagner's radio call for help (Mr. Whiting lives on a boat and during his waking hours always monitors radio) at approximately 0130 hours and in turn called a friend on the Isthmus to go to the Wagner boat and advise him of the situation and if a search should be started.

When it was determined that indeed the dinghy and Natalia Wood were missing, a search was begun with Harbor Patrol, Bay Watch, private searchers, L.A. County Sheriff and U.S. Coast Guard all participating.

Mrs. Wagner's body was found approximately 200 yards off the Blue Cavem Point, Isthmus area of Catalina Island, and north of where the

dinghy was found, near the shoreline, a couple hours earlier.

was also questioned regarding the possibility of suicide, however he states that wife was not suicidal.

Don Whiting was one of the private searches who located the dinghy and says that key was in the ignition, which was in the off position. The gear was in neutral and the oars tied down, and it appeared as if the boat had not even been used.

Decedent's body had been taken from the ocean and placed in the Hyperbaric Chamber building for safe keeping. Upon this investigators arrival at location, decedent observed lying in "stokes litter". Decedent is wrapped in plastic sheet, she herself is dressed in flannel nightgown and socks. The jacket that she was wearing when found floating, is no longer on the body, having come off when she was pulled from the water. At time decedent was pulled from the water, sheriff's personnel says that body was absent of any rigor and they noted foam coming from mouth. Decedent still has foam coming from mouth. Rigor is now present of a 3 to 4+ throughout her entire body. Decedent has numerous bruises to legs and arms. Decedent's eyes are also a bit cloudy appearing. No other traums noted and foul play is not suspected at this time.

Skipper of the Wagner boat, Dennis Davern, identified body to sheriff's deputies.

EXTERNAL DESCRIPTION:

The body is that of a well-developed and well-nourished Caucasian female which appears to be about the stated age of 43-years-old, weighing approximately 120 pounds and measuring approximately 64 inches in height. The body shows a moderate generalized rigor mortis. The hair is brown and long. The eyes are brown. are no petechiae in the conjunctivae or sclerae. The nostrils and mouth show white froth. The ears are not remarkable. neck, chest and abdomen show abnormality except for an old surgical scar on the lower midline of the abdominal wall measuring approximately 5 inches in length. The right forearm shows a diffuse recent bruise over the lateral aspect measuring approximately 4 inches x l inch area above the wrist. The left wrist is slightly deformed on the lateral condyle of the ulna and it is very prominent. There is no fresh fracture in this this area. A slight superficial fresh bruise is noted in this area measuring approximately 1/2 inch in diameter. There are numerous small superficial skin bruises over the right and left lower legs measuring approximately 1/2 inch to 1 inch in diameter. They appear to be relatively fresh. The left knee area shows a recent bruise measuring approximately 2 inches in diameter. The right ankle area shows a recent bruise measuring approximately 2 inches in diameter. There are superficial bruises on the posterior aspect of the lower legs. They are small, superficial and measuring approximately 1/2 inch to 2 inches in diameter. There is no particular pattern.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION:

The body is opened with the Y-shaped incision. The organs in the chest and abdomen are located in their normal anatomical positions. There are no traumatic injuries over the chest or abdomen. No hemorrhage is noted on the chest wall or chest cavities. The abdominal cavity shows no excessive fluid or adhesion. No contusion or hemorrhage is noted.

CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM:

The pericardial sac shows approximately 20 cc. of serous fluid. The heart is normal in size and it weighs 220 grams. There are no petechial hemorrhages over the epicardium. The sections show grossly normal epicardium, myocardium and endocardium. The chambers contains approximately 50 cc. of fluid blood. The blood is separately collected and submitted for toxicologic tests. The valves show no abnormality. The coronary arteries show normal branching with widely patent lumen. The left anterior descending branch shows a focal narrowing of mild degree due to the atherosclerotic plaque which is less than 30% narrowing. The aorta also shows a mild arteriosclerosis in the abdominal segment.

RESPIRATORY SYSTEM:

The larynx, trachea and bronchi are filled with a large amount of white froth. The lungs are voluminous and heavy. The surface of the lungs are smooth with a few petechial hemorrhages. The right lung weighs 800 grams and the left lung weighs 750 grams. The sections of the lungs show abundant amount of watery fluid with froth. There is no evidence of pneumonia or tumor.

HEPATOBILIARY SYSTEM:

The liver is about normal in size and it weighs 1450 grams. The capsular surface is smooth with a dark brownish-red color. The sections show grossly normal hepatic lobular architecture. There is no cirrhosis or fatty change. The gallbladder contains approximately 10 cc. of light green bile. No obstruction is noted in the biliary duct system.

HEMATOLYMPHATIC SYSTEM:

The spleen is small and it weighs only 40 grams. The surface of the spleen is slightly wrinkled. The sections show no abnormality. The lymph nodes are not remarkable. The thymus is normal for the age. The bone marrow is not remarkable.

DIGESTIVE SYSTEM: -

The tongue shows no abnormality. The stomach shows a froth but the esopahgus shows no abnormality except for a small amount of partly digested food. The stomach is filled with approximately 500 cc. of semisolid partly digested food. Most of the food appears to be either chicken or fish type of substance. In addition there are few patchy areas of red discoloration in the stomach contents. The small intestine contains 2 pills which are not dissolved and they appear to be a large size of vitamin-like substance by the appearance and by the smell. The gastric contents emits the smelling of alcohol. The appendix is not remarkable. The small and large intestine show no injury. No tumor is noted. The rectum is not remarkable.

ENDOCRINE SYSTEM:

The adrenal glands, thyroid and pituitary glands are not remarkable. They are located in their normal anatomical positions and are about normal in configuration. The pancreas is about normal in size and the sections show no abnormality.

GENITOURINARY SYSTEM:

The kidneys are located in their normal anatomical position. The right kidney weighs 130 grams and the left weighs 150 grams. The capsular surface is smooth and the sections show grossly normal cortex and medulla with congestion. The ureters are not remarkable. The urinary bladder contains approximately 300 cc. of amber colored fluid. The uterus is normal in size and the sections show grossly normal myometrium and endometrium. The endometrium appears to be in the proliferative stage. The sections of the uterus, cervix and ovaries show no evidence of tumor or inflammation.

MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM:

There are numerous small, superficial skin bruises over the legs but there are no deep contusions noted on the sections. The wounds show no fracture. The abrasions over the left cheek area appear to be superficial and fresh. These abrasions are brush type abrasions on the vertical dimension.

HEAD AND CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM:

There are no injuries in the scalp or skull. The meninges are clear but congested. The brain is about normal in size and it weighs 1250 grams. It is symmetrical and it shows a normal gyri and sulci externally. The brain is submitted for neuropathologic examination. The base of the skull shows congested temporal bones. No actual hemorrhage is noted with the temporal bones in the ear.

NECK ORGANS:

The neck organs are dissected and they show no traumatic injuries. The hyoid bone, thyroid cartilage and cricoid cartilage show no injury. There is no evidence of strangulation.

CLOTHING:

The body was clad with a wet flannel type gown and wool socks. No underwear was on the body. One (1) red down jacket is accompanied with the body but it was not on the body. The examination of the clothing revealed no tear or blood. They are all wet.

HISTOLOGICAL SECTIONS:

Representative sections are taken for the hold jar and sections from the bruised area of the extremites are taken for the microscopic examination.

TOXICOLOGIC TESTS:

The blood, urine, bile, stomach contents, liver tissue and kidney tissue are submitted for toxicologic investigation. The blood from the right and left chambers of heart are separately submitted for the chemical tests.

RADIOLOGIC EXAMINATION:

The entire body is fluroscoped and x-rays of the head, neck, chest and extremities are made. No fracture is noted.

WITNESSES:

Investigating Officer Serrano and his partner of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department came and witnessed the autopsy.

OPINION:

The autopsy findings are consistent with drowning in the ocean. The time of the death is difficult to pinpoint, but it appears to be at about midnight of November 28, 1981. Most of the bruises on the body are superficial and probably sustained at the time of drowning.

HISTORY: Presumed victim of drowning.

GROSS DESCRIPTION:

Specimen consists of formalin-fixed brain, dorsal convexity portion of crainal dura, tentorium cerebelli, and portions stripped from the adjacent posterior fossa. Both external and internal surfaces of cranial dura show no abnormality; specifically there is no evidence of recent or old hemorrhagic staining.

Brain weighed 1,250 grams at removal. Overall configuration is usual and cerebral hemispheres are approximately symmetrical. Superficial meningeal blood vessels show mild to moderate symmetrical congestion; otherwise the leptomeninges are thin and transparent throughout without recent or old subarachnoid hemorrhage. Mild thickening along the parasagittal region is consistent with the age. Gyral-sulcal pattern is usual except for an unusually broad postcentral sulcus on the left side; however, the adjacent cortex shows no shrinkage or softening.

At the base, major arteries are normal in caliber and course except for asymmetrical vertebral arteries, being slightly smaller on the right, thin-walled, and free of atherosclerosis. Optic nerves are grossly intact as are the remainder of the cranial nerves. Rectus-orbital frontal areas show no abnormalities. Region of the uncus is of normal configuration on both sides. Brainstem and cerebellum are externally unremarkable.

Coronal sections of the cerebral hemispheres reveal symmetrical lateral ventricles of normal size. Septum pellucidum is intact and lies at the midline. The third ventricle is of normal width and is also at the midline; fourth is intact. Cerebral cortical ribbon, central white matter, corpus callosum, basal ganglia, thalamus, and hippocampal formation all appear grossly intact. Multiple transverse sections of the midbrain, pons, medulla, show no gross change, and the cerebellum is intact.

Representative sections are submitted for microscopic examination.

GROSS IMPRESSIONS:

A. Grossly normal adult brain except for mild to moderate congestion.

Sections of brain (5) stained by H&E method include cerebral cortex, hippocampal formation, dorsal thalamus, globus pallidus, and cerebellum. Aside from mild congestion and fine scattered morular calcification in globus pallidus, there is no important histologic abnormality.






